### Meeting Highlights:

- Nick Watterson of Luhdorff and Scalmanini Engineering gave a presentation on the historical hydrology of the Solano subbasin and the water budget. The focus of discussion was on how to present the “current” water budget in accordance with GSP regulations. He acknowledged that climate change is one of many factors that can affect the projected water budget, and that the plan should include adaptive management strategies to address this uncertainty. The group provided feedback on the approach, and LSCE committed to bringing a decision process on the historical/current/projected hydrology for the water budget to a future meeting of the GSA Collaborative.
- Davids Engineering sent each GSA the spreadsheet information for the preliminary water budget. They can set up conversations with each GSA before 2/12 to go over the data.
- Collaborative members reviewed the Stakeholder Engagement strategy, presented by Ag Innovations and The Freshwater Trust and Local Government Council.
  - Collaborative members decided to conduct two rounds of meetings for 2020 (spring and fall) in 2 locations, Vacaville and Dixon. Attendance was poor in Rio

Vista, and the GSA Collaborative will deliberate on how and when the session in Rio Vista should take place and any added outreach possibilities.

- TFT and LGC reviewed their findings from outreach to DAC and SDAC communities. In the coming year, their focus will be determining how to support communication to these various communities, either by getting more people to public meetings, or by figuring out other ways to get information to them and input from them.
- Collaborative members discussed the composition of, and nominating process for, the Citizen Advisory Committee, whose objective is to represent the broader interests of citizens in the Solano subbasin beyond those whose interests are already represented through the GSA boards, and to weigh in on sections of the GSP requiring public input. Collaborative members committed to thinking about potential members and bringing ideas to the next Collaborative meeting.
- The next GSA Collaborative meeting is rescheduled for 2/24 from 11am-1pm.
