Meeting Highlights:

- Members gave updates about changes in operations due to COVID 19: most are working at least partially from home, and experiencing fairly smooth transitions to working virtually.
- The Prop 68 Grant Agreement is set to be signed by the 5/15 deadline.
- 70 letters have been sent to well owners requesting participation, but visits have been delayed due to COVID 19.

- The team is preparing for chapter review, including IDing the process of chapter review and developing a process for capturing GSA Collaborative comments to input into the chapter. Effort is being made to ensure a process that is open, transparent and not redundant.
- LSCE is anticipating the release of the SVSim model by the end of April.
- The Collaborative reviewed the 2019 Survey results. Highlights:
 - Respondents expressed a preference for virtual engagement (email and broadcasts)
 - Most of those surveyed were ag or domestic well users
 - Respondents cared most about reliability, quality, and recharge.
- The June 16 and 17 public input sessions are being reoriented due to Covid-19. Ag Innovations is looking at an array of options, including recording(s) of presentations with asynchronous Q&A sessions, Zoom meetings, government access TV, and distribution of the new version of the survey for that.
