HIGHLIGHTS

- Annual Report: Data has been received, allowing the first Annual Report to be prepared.
 The draft should be available in March, requiring a quick review and response from the GSAs so that the report can be submitted to DWR by April 1.
- Financial Plan: Costs for GSP administration and implementation, excluding individual
 projects and management actions (PMAs) are expected to range from \$738k to \$1.05M
 each year between 2022 and 2027. Cost categories may need to be changed. The GSAs
 will need to provide guidance on setting the inflation rate, whether or not to smooth
 costs, and the preferred option for allocating costs.

- Rate Study: The standard method for setting rates is to establish revenue needs for a
 five-year period. Developing the fees in 2022 will set rates through 2027. A timeline for
 the Rate Study was provided, concluding with a submittal of assessment rates to the
 assessor by mid-July. It was noted that Federal, state, and Tribal lands are not subject to
 Prop 218 fees. The study will involve public outreach and extensive coordination among
 the GSAs. Contributions are welcome to help defray the costs of the study.
- GSP Implementation MOU: An Implementation MOU will be drafted and circulated to the GSAs for review and feedback.
